## Doctrinal Orientation or Being Directed by God's Thinking

The Bible is the best book that we will ever have. It is the instruction book of how to live the spiritual life. God wrote the Bible using men to put down the words. The Bible is the word of God. It is the thinking of Jesus Christ! God has not left us to try to figure life out for ourselves. The Bible tells us what we must do now that we are Christians. 
What great protection God gives us in our spiritual battle!

Deuteronomy 11:18 Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds;


Doctrinal orientation is being oriented to God's plan. This means that we bring our thinking into line with the thinking of the Lord Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ's thinking, which is God's thinking, is in the Bible. God wants us to obey Him and depend on His wisdom or thinking. He doesn't want us to depend on our own human viewpoint - lack of wisdom. Dependence on God's wisdom is using His thinking! Great thoughts!

The LORD is my portion, says my soul, therefore I have hope in Him. The LORD is good to those who trust in Him, to the soul who seeks Him.




Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.

Romans 15:4 For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope [confidence].



2 Peter 3:18 ...but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory both now and forever! Amen.



John 8:32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.


